Programme Overview

Enrich your academic experience at University of Toronto (UofT) while living on the University's historic campus in the centre of the city of Toronto during the beautiful summer season. University of Toronto Summer Term is offered exclusively to Faculty of Science students only.

Location

The programme takes place in Toronto, Canada, St. George Campus, Faculty of Arts & Science.

Dates

Students may only participate in one summer session.

Summer Session 1 (Session F): 8 May 2023 to 26 June 2023

Summer Session 2 (Session S): 4 July 2023 to 25 August 2023

(Students will need to apply for short-term Leave of Absence via <u>myEduRec</u> for the period from 14 August 2023 onwards, depending on the date of the last exam in UofT.)

*Orientation is mandatory

Academic Information

- If you are admitted by UofT, you will be choosing your actual courses based on the 2023 Summer Final Timetable (which is usually published in end-March).

- Students need to take courses on a letter-graded basis for credit transfer.

Credit Transfer

Students are required to enrol in 1 credit per summer session, which is equivalent to 2 courses.

Students may apply for module mapping and transfer a maximum of 10 MCs from the programme. Module mapping is subject to approval by the respective faculties.

Students can transfer a total of 12 MCs from a maximum of 2 overseas summer/winter programmes without having to pay tuition at NUS during their course of study at NUS. Any additional MCs mapped will be subjected to NUS Special Term fees.

Module mapping and credit transfer for online summer programmes is not allowed.

Eligibility Criteria

NUS students must:

- Be a full-time Faculty of Science student with a first major in Science
- Year 1, Year 2 and Year 3 students may apply
- Not intending to graduate at the end of AY2022/2023 Semester 2
- Minimum CAP of 3.5
- Have a clean disciplinary record
- Be fully vaccinated
- National Servicemen who are not called up for In-Camp Training (ICT). Deferment letter will not be provided.

Priority will be given to year 2 and 3 students who have not participated in SEP or been offered an SEP place.

Number of places

There are 15 places available.

Programme Cost

Students do not need to pay NUS Special Term fees nor tuition fees to UofT if they do not exceed the credits transfer limit stated under the section "Credit Transfer" above. However, students are responsible for their own airfare, accommodation, meals, personal expenses, etc.

Programme Application Procedure and Deadline

Login to <u>Education Records System (EduRec)</u> and submit your application under External Study Type 'Summer/Winter'. Ext. Study Setup ID is **02285**. Please refer to <u>Guide for Student Programme</u> <u>Application</u> BEFORE your application. You will need to log on to <u>NUS WebVPN</u> before accessing the Guide and EduRec.

Do indicate your choice of session. You may apply for both sessions. However, students will only be selected for ONE session if deemed eligible.

Application Deadline: 25 January - 5 February 2023, 11:59pm Singapore Time

To be fair to students who abide by the deadlines, we regret that incomplete or late application will <u>strictly</u> not be considered.

Document required (upload into your online application in EduRec):

- Latest NUS unofficial transcript (downloable from EduRec) Name the file using this format "Matric number_Full Name_Transcript"
- Vaccination Certificate Name the file using this format "Matric number_Full Name_VaxCert"

<u>Note 1</u>: Students must complete the e-training module "E-Training Package on Student Essentials" via LumiNUS, to be able to generate their unofficial transcript. Students can only generate their unofficial transcript via EduRec, 3 working days after the completion of the e-training module.

Note 2: Upon being offered a place in the programme, students are required to submit a cheque deposit of \$1,500. This deposit will be refunded to students once it has been verified that students have passed the two (2) courses at the University of Toronto when the official transcript from the University of Toronto is received by the Science Dean's Office.

<u>Note 3</u>: After the application deadline has closed, please check your mailbox regularly for the outcome of your application as there is a tight deadline for students to accept offer, nomination and application to University of Toronto.

Insurance

All students travelling overseas for activities or purposes approved, endorsed, organised, sponsored or authorised by NUS will be covered by the NUS Student Travel Insurance Policy. Click <u>here</u> for more information.

Exclusions to the NUS Student Travel Insurance may apply. Students are to ensure that they have sufficient travel insurance coverage, and may consider purchasing additional travel insurance if required.

UofT's University Health Insurance Plan (UHIP) is a mandatory health insurance plan for all international students enrolled in an Ontario university. All exchange students are automatically enrolled in UHIP <u>https://inboundvisiting.utoronto.ca/inbound-exchange/admitted-students/</u>.
