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## IMPORTANT INFORMATION

#### Courses offered within Science for Semester 1, AY2024/2025

Under the current guidelines, all our teaching venues will be operating at their full capacities. Do note that some large classes will adopt blended learning for their lectures, but tutorials and seminars may still be conducted in-person. #### Courses and Exam Timetable

To ensure that you are referring to the timetable for the correct Academic Year/Semester, please kindly check the header on NUSMods. Please note that the timetable for Semester 1, AY2024/2025 is likely to be updated on NUSMods from the week of Monday, 8 July. For the latest updates in NUSMods, please refer to it regularly from the week of Monday, 8 July.

The onus is on the student to map out the study plan and avoid registering for courses with clashes in class or examination timetable. <u>The Faculty of Science is not supportive of timetable clash waivers</u>. Appeals are <u>only</u> considered if students require the course to fulfil their graduation requirement in their graduating semester, without which might lead to a delay in graduation. ## **REGISTRATION EXERCISE AY2024/2025**

The Registration Exercise for all Pharmacy freshmen will be held in 2 parts and both parts are compulsory. You should have received an email from the Office of the University Registrar (OUR) detailing the registration procedures by now. #### **Registration (Part One)**

All freshmen regardless of citizenship should have completed registration (Part One) and obtained your Student ID, PIN, NUSNET ID & NUSNET Password by now. This is personal and confidential information which should not be shared with anyone else. You will need to use the NUSNET ID and NUSNET password to access the various online systems in NUS. Freshmen under the age of 18 years at the point of completion of registration (Part One) may refer to the Registration Guide for other instructions.



#### Registration (Part Two)

Students are advised to read the Registration Guide for detailed instructions on this process. In Registration (Part Two), students will receive their Student Cards. By completing Registration (Part Two), you are officially registered as a student at the National University of Singapore.

If you have completed Registration (Part One) and had your submitted photo approved yet have not received email notification to collect your Student Card, please write to <u>UGRegistration@nus.edu.sg</u>.

## STUDENT'S PASS REQUIREMENTS FOR INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

It is the University's requirement that all full-time international students must hold a valid Student's Pass (STP) when term starts. Students who do not have a valid Student's Pass by the stipulated deadline will be liable for warning first; and subsequent dismissal from NUS if they do not heed the warning within 7 days. Their Student's Pass will also be cancelled. ## PRE-ADMISSION MEDICAL EXAMINATION (PAME)

It is the University's policy that as an admission condition, all incoming students (excluding nongraduating students and continuing & professional education students) are required to undergo a medical examination. Please refer to

A Negative Service Indicator (NSI) will be imposed if students do not complete the PAME. The NSI has the following effect:

- Unable to view exam results / enroll for any courses
- Unable to obtain official / unofficial result transcripts
- Student status / conferment letter will be withheld
- Degree scroll will be withheld

The Pre-Admission Medical Examination (PAME) is considered incomplete:

- a. If the student has not undergone the PAME.
- b. The student has completed the PAME but did not submit the completed PAME form.
- c. The student has completed the PAME but has outstanding tests/ the test result is unsatisfactory. This tends to be outstanding urine tests which the student could close the loop by going back to the clinic to complete the tests or submit the outstanding medical report from specialist.
- d. Students have submitted a medical report (e.g. health screening medical report) that does not meet the University's medical examination requirements. Student can close the loop by submitting the needful report as required by UHC.

Students can complete the PAME via these options:

- a. Medical examinations may be conducted by the University Health Centre (UHC)
- b. By a private registered health physician.

## ACADEMIC PLAN APPLICATION AND DECLARATION

Academic Plan **Declaration** allows you to declare your major, during the main semesters. Please note that you will not be allowed to register for courses unless the Academic Plan has been declared. You are also only allowed to make one declaration per semester. Pharmacy students are allowed to read a maximum of 1 Major Programme only. Please refer to the online user guide on how to proceed with the Academic Plan Declaration;

Note: You are required to submit your declaration in the Academic Plan Declaration system by <u>08:59hrs,</u> <u>21 July 2024</u> for a smooth user experience when doing CourseReg which starts on <u>22 July 2024</u>. You <u>will not</u> be able to access and participate in the CourseReg (Course Registration) exercise unless you have done Academic Plan Declaration <u>at least 24 hours</u> before. Only <u>one</u> attempt is allowed per semester, and no changes are allowed after the declaration is submitted.

#### Select Courses Rounds

Do note that Round 1 is a protected round, where students will be able to select courses that can be used towards:

- Programme (Major, Specialisation) requirements
- Second Major requirements
- Direct admission/ Restricted Minor requirements
- Prescribed English requirements (i.e. courses offered by CELC)

Round 2 and Round 3 are open rounds where students are able to select all courses (including General Education courses) they wish to read for the semester.

#### <u>Workload</u>

All Single Degree students can select up to a maximum of 23 Units from Select Courses Round 1 to Round 2. From Round 3 onwards, the workload allowance shall be in accordance with the student's GPA.



For freshmen, all Single Degree students can select up to a maximum of 23 Units while Double Degree students and students involved in Special Programmes can select up to a maximum of 27 Units in their first semester. Students may only apply to read beyond the maximum workload allowed from their second semester of study onwards by application during the CourseReg period.

Do note that the stipulated **minimum workload** that each student should have is **18 Units per semester**. Students are only allowed to underload in their graduating semester, or if they are doing credit-bearing internship.

# NUS DATA PROTECTION POLICY AND PERSONAL DATA PROTECTION ACT (PDPA) GUIDELINES

Recently, Singapore has seen multiple cases of data breaches and attacks on our IT infrastructure. Understanding that the University is not immune to these incidents and threats, we have taken direction from the Singapore Personal Data Protection Commission (PDPC) to roll out an e-training course DP1001 NUS Data Protection Policy and Personal Data Protection Act (PDPA) Guidelines to all undergraduates.

All students are required to complete the e-training course, "E-Training Package on Student Essentials" via <u>Canvas</u>.

## QUALIFYING ENGLISH TEST (QET)

All incoming Faculty of Science students (both local and international) who do not possess the necessary English Qualifications would have been informed by the Office of the University Registrar (OUR) to take their QET. Students will be notified by the Centre for English Language Communications (CELC) of their QET results.

- Students who obtain Band 1 will have to take ES1000 followed by ES1103
- Students who obtain Band 2 will have to take ES1103
- Students who obtain Band 3 are exempted from these English courses

Students are strongly advised to complete the required course(s) within the first year of study. Students who are required to read both ES1000 and ES1103 may read ES1000 in the first semester of study and ES1103 in the second semester of study. ES1000 has 0 units and does not count towards the minimum workload. Please refer to the <u>CELC website</u> for more information.



## COMMON CURRICULUM FOR HEALTHCARE PROFESSIONALS

Pharmacy students admitted from AY2023/24 onwards will read the full suite of NUS Common Curriculum for Healthcare Professionals (CCHP) in place of General Education requirements. The new Common Curriculum for Healthcare Professional Education will apply social and behavioural determinants of health to social prescribing and planetary health; use data and digital literacy to enable population healthcare planning, delivery and evaluation; and strengthen interdisciplinary engagement as well as experiential learning.

The common curriculum comprises the following five pillars:

- i. Social and Behavioural Determinants of Health
- ii. Professional Practice 1: The Foundations of Health Professionalism
- iii. Data Literacy for Healthcare
- iv. Professional Practice 2: Basic Skills in Health Professionalism
- v. Digital Literacy for Healthcare

## **GENERAL EDUCATION (GE) CURRICULUM**

Students admitted from AY2021/22 onwards (except students from Law, Medicine, Dentistry) will experience a new curriculum introduced by the GE Reform, which aims to ensure that the GE curriculum continues to provide a unique and relevant learning experience for students to thrive in today's rapidly-changing world. The new curriculum features the following six pillars:

- vi. Cultures and Connections
- vii. Critique and Expression
- viii. Data Literacy
- ix. Digital Literacy
- x. Singapore Studies
- xi. Communities and Engagement

Students are required to read one course from each pillar to fulfil their GE requirements. Pharmacy students are exempted from the Communities and Engagement pillar, and the remaining 5 pillars are embedded within the Common Curriculum for Healthcare Professionals. Hence, Pharmacy students will satisfy the GE requirements upon completion of the Common Curriculum for Healthcare Professionals.

### DEGREE REQUIREMENTS

#### Minimum Unit Requirements

- i. At least 160 Units total
- ii. Minimum Units that must be earned from NUS courses <u>https://www.nus.edu.sg/registrar/academic-information-policies/undergraduate-</u> <u>students/continuation-and-graduation-requirements#MinUnitRequirements</u>
- iii. At most 60 Units of Level-1000 courses; any excess does not count towards the total Units graduation requirements. The following courses do not count toward the 60 Units limit:
  - a. CFG1002 Career Catalyst (2 units)#
  - b. CFG1004 Financial Wellbeing Art and Science of Investing (2 units)#
  - c. CFG1500 Women's Professional Development Programme (2 units)#
  - d. CFG1600 CommsLab Public Speaking (2 units)#
  - e. ES1103 English for Academic Purposes (4 units)
  - f. Courses under the Design-Your-Own-Course (DYOC) initiative
  - g. HS1301 Workplace Communication (2 units)^

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# Exclusion of CFG1002, CFG1004, CFG1500, CFG1600 from the limit on Level-1000 courses is applicable to BIZ, FASS, FoS, SoC, SDE, and FoE students from Cohort AY2016/17 onwards.

<sup>^</sup> Exclusion of HS1301 from the limit on Level-1000 courses is applicable to CHS students from Cohort AY2021/22 onwards.

The onus is on the student to check their fulfillment of Graduation Requirements based on these two reports. You are strongly advised to refer to the graduation requirements available on the Faculty of Science website and the Bulletin based on your cohort.

## S/U OPTION ENTITLEMENT

With the launch of Enhanced Grade-free Scheme with effect from AY2016/17 Semester 1, students may exercise the S/U option for up to 32 Units in the first two regular semesters. If this is not fully utilised, the S/U option may be exercised in subsequent semesters, for up to 12 Units.

Variations on the limit of S/U options that can be exercised apply for specific groups of students:

- i. Students without prior university experience but are granted 20 or more Advanced Placement Credits (APCs) at the point of admission to NUS may exercise the S/U option for up to 20 Units in the first year; if this is not fully utilised, the S/U option may still be exercised in subsequent semesters, for up to 12 Units.
- ii. Students with some prior university experience (which are being recognised towards the NUS degree) may exercise the S/U option for up to 12 Units anytime during their candidature, including the first year.
- iii. Students with a prior university degree are not eligible for the grade-free scheme.

#### Key Points to Note

- Both the 'S' and 'U' grade count towards the total S/U Option entitlement.
- For courses read on an S/U basis, the Units are obtained only if a student attains a Satisfactory 'S' grade for the courses.
- All courses read on S/U basis are excluded from the computation of the GPA
- S/U option, once exercised, is irrevocable. Students may not later request for a conversion to a letter grade.

## **CONTINUATION, PROBATION AND DISMISSAL**

To remain in good academic standing, and to continue in an undergraduate programme of study, a student may not have GPA below 2.00 for two consecutive semesters. For any semester in which the student's GPA falls below 2.00, s/he will be placed on probation. If the student's GPA remains below 2.00 for the second consecutive semester, the student will be issued a letter of dismissal by the Office of the University Registrar (OUR) and denied re-admission. The student may appeal against the dismissal if there are extenuating circumstances. However, each student is only allowed to appeal <u>once</u> during his/her candidature.

With the launch of Enhanced Grade-free Scheme:

- For students eligible to exercise ≥ 20 Units of S/U options, the above continuation rules are applied from the third semester onwards.
- For students eligible to exercise ≤ 12 Units of S/U options, the above continuation rules are applied from the first semester onwards.

Students who face difficulties in coping with their studies are encouraged to approach their academic mentors for guidance and support. The respective mentors will be able to guide and advise students of the various avenues where help is available. ## FEE POLICIES

#### **Tuition Fee Beyond Normal Candidature**

With effect from the admission cohort of AY2016/2017, students admitted into an undergraduate degree under the modular system in NUS and who take longer than the normal candidature period to complete their degree requirements will have to pay partial non-subsidized fees, culminating in full non-subsidized fees, during the extended semesters.

In view that the Ministry of Education provides a Tuition Grant to subsidize a student's tuition fees up to the normal candidature period, the tuition fee payable beyond that would be the full non-subsidized semestral fees. To mitigate the impact of higher fees, the University undertakes to charge affected students only a proportion of the full non-subsidized semestral fees pro-rated based on the Units read in the extended semesters. In addition, the pro-rated full fees payable in the first and second semester beyond normal candidature will be capped at 120% and 150% of the subsidized semestral fees respectively.

The fees payable beyond normal candidature period are summarized in the following table:

\*9th semester for DDP (single honours) and 10th semester for DDP (double honours) (refer here).

Students who register for course(s) in the Special Term immediately following the expiry of their normal candidature period will continue to pay subsidised fees on a per course basis. However, for the Special Terms beyond that, the Special Term fees payable will be the full non-subsidised semestral fees pro-rated based on the number of Units read.
