The Hong Kong University of Science and Technology (HKUST) Summer School 2025 (in-person)

Programme Overview

Students will study at least 2 credits and up to 8 credits of regular undergraduate-level courses for each session offered by HKUST. Refer here for the programme information and the courses offered for HKUST Summer School 2025: https://isp.hkust.edu.hk/

Location

This programme takes place in Hong Kong.

Dates

Students are strongly encouraged to participate only in one summer session.

Summer Session 1: 12 June 2025 to 12 July 2025

Summer Session 2: 10 July 2025 to 9 August 2025

Course Mapping and Credit Transfer

Students may apply for course mapping and transfer a maximum of 10 units from one summer programme. Course mapping is subject to approval by the respective faculties.

Students can transfer a total of 12 units from a maximum of 2 overseas summer/winter programmes without having to pay tuition at NUS during their course of study. Any additional units mapped will be subjected to NUS Special Term fees.

HKUST courses may have pre-requisite(s). Fulfilment of pre-requisite(s) are reviewed and determined at the discretion of HKUST.

Course mapping and credit transfer for online summer programmes is not allowed.

Eligibility Criteria

NUS students must:

- Be a full-time Faculty of Science student with a first major in Science
- Year 1, 2 and 3 students may apply
- Not intending to graduate at the end of AY2024/2025 Semester 2
- Minimum GPA of 3.0
- Have a clean disciplinary record
- Be fully vaccinated
- National Servicemen who are not called up for In-Camp Training (ICT). Deferment letter will not be provided.

Number of places

There are 6 places available.

Accommodation

All students will be provided University housing. Students will be assigned to a shared room in a student hall for the whole programme duration.

Programme Cost

Students do not need to pay NUS Special Term fees or tuition fees to HKUST if they do not exceed the credits transfer limit stated under the section "Credit Transfer" above. However, students are responsible for their own airfare, accommodation, meals, personal expenses, etc.

Student Visa

All international students (except holders of Hong Kong Identity Card who have the right to land and study in Hong Kong) are required to obtain a student visa to study in Hong Kong. The student visa processing time is normally 8 to 10 weeks. Incomplete application and missing documents will cause delays. Whether a student is granted a student visa is at the discretion of the Hong Kong Immigration Department. Students who fail to obtain the appropriate document for the right to study in Hong Kong will be declined participation in ISP.

Programme Application Procedure and Deadline

Login to <u>Education Records System (EduRec)</u> and submit your application under External Study Type 'Summer/Winter'. Ext. Study Setup ID is **03073**.

No document submission is required.

Application Deadline: 24 December 2024 - 7 January 2025, 11:59pm Singapore Time

To be fair to students who abide by the deadlines, we regret that incomplete or late application will strictly not be considered.

Note: Completion of the Travel Preparedness Course (TPC) on Canvas

via https://canvas.nus.edu.sg/enroll/LECK9W is required before you can begin your SEP application in EduRec. You can only apply for SEP on EduRec-Global Education 24 hours after completion of the TPC. You are advised to complete the TPC early to pre-empt potential technical issues. If you have previously completed the Overseas Travel Preparedness Course (OTP), you do not have to complete TPC again.
