### **Programme Overview**

Enrich your academic experience at University of Toronto (UofT) while living on the University's historic campus in the centre of the city of Toronto during the beautiful summer season. University of Toronto Summer Term is offered exclusively to Faculty of Science students only.

### Location

The programme takes place in Toronto, Canada, St. George Campus, Faculty of Arts & Science.

## Dates

Students may only participate in one summer session.

Summer Session 1 (Session F): 5 May 2025 to 24 June 2025

### Summer Session 2 (Session S): 2 July 2025 to 25 August 2025

The above dates include the last day of the final exam for each session. The last day of the programme depends on the dates of the final exams.

\*Orientation is mandatory. Students whose final exams are on-going after the start of session 1 will not be able to participate in session 1.

(For session 2, students will need to apply for short-term Leave of Absence via <u>myEduRec</u> for the period from 11 August 2025 onwards, depending on the date of the last exam in UofT.)

# **Academic Information**

- If you are admitted by UofT, you will be choosing your actual courses based on the 2025 Summer Final Timetable (which is usually published in end-March).
- Refer <u>here</u> for the list of restricted programmes and courses.
- Students need to take courses on a letter-graded basis for credit transfer.

# **Course Mapping and Credit Transfer**

Students are required to enrol in 1 credit per summer session, which is equivalent to 2 courses.

Students may apply for course mapping and transfer a maximum of 10 units from the programme. Course mapping is subject to approval by the respective faculties.

Students can transfer a total of 12 units from a maximum of 2 overseas summer/winter programmes without having to pay tuition at NUS during their course of study at NUS. Any additional units mapped will be subjected to NUS Special Term fees.

### Course mapping and credit transfer for online summer programmes is not allowed.

# **Eligibility Criteria**

NUS students must:

- Be a full-time Faculty of Science student with a first major in Science
- Year 1, Year 2 and Year 3 students may apply
- Not intending to graduate at the end of AY2024/2025 Semester 2
- Minimum GPA of 3.5
- Have a clean disciplinary record
- Be fully vaccinated
- National Servicemen who are not called up for In-Camp Training (ICT). Deferment letter will not be provided.

## Number of places

There are 15 places available.

## **Programme Cost**

Students do not need to pay NUS Special Term fees nor tuition fees to UofT if they do not exceed the credits transfer limit stated under the section "Credit Transfer" above. However, students are responsible for their own airfare, accommodation, meals, personal expenses, etc.

# **Programme Application Procedure and Deadline**

Login to <u>Education Records System (EduRec)</u> and submit your application under External Study Type 'Summer/Winter'. Ext. Study Setup ID is **03073**.

Do indicate your choice of session. You may apply for both sessions. However, students will only be selected for ONE session if deemed eligible.

No document submission is required.

Application Deadline: 24 December 2024 – 7 January 2025, 11:59pm Singapore Time

To be fair to students who abide by the deadlines, we regret that incomplete or late application will <u>strictly</u> not be considered.

<u>Note 1</u>: Completion of the Travel Preparedness Course (TPC) on Canvas via <u>https://canvas.nus.edu.sg/enroll/LECK9W</u> is required before you can begin your SEP application in EduRec. You can only apply for SEP on EduRec-Global Education 24 hours after completion of the TPC. You are advised to complete the TPC early to pre-empt potential technical issues. If you have previously completed the Overseas Travel Preparedness Course (OTP), you do not have to complete TPC again. <u>Note 2</u>: After the application deadline has closed, please check your mailbox regularly for the outcome of your application as there is a tight deadline for students to accept offer, nomination and application to University of Toronto.

<u>Note 3</u>: Within four (4) months upon completion of programme, students are required to submit the official transcript from the University of Toronto to the Science Dean's Office to verify that they have passed the two (2) courses at the University of Toronto. Failure to do so will result in a penalty fee of \$1,500 to be charged to the student bill.

## Insurance

All students travelling overseas for activities or purposes approved, endorsed, organised, sponsored or authorised by NUS will be covered by the NUS Student Travel Insurance Policy. Click <u>here</u> for more information.

Exclusions to the NUS Student Travel Insurance may apply. Students are to ensure that they have sufficient travel insurance coverage, and may consider purchasing additional travel insurance if required.
